














REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND MHPSS*

The number of calls to national hotlines for counselling and psychosocial support increased during strict lockdowns, especially calls from women. The number of people seeking counselling has **steadily increased** since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. Power cuts **impact accessibility** of the hotlines. There was a sharp rise in the number of people reached when popular social media was used.1


EDUCATION

ethnicity and wealth.¹¹





Between 2017-2022, women made up 70% of the enrolment in project-supported Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) and Skills Development courses were women (8640 women and 3713 men) in 2017-2022¹³







Key observations:

The gross enrolment ratio in both lower and upper secondary schools reduced sharply in 2020-21 compared to 2019-20. The gross enrolment ratio of girls reached its lowest at both lower and upper secondary schools in 2020-21.¹²





TECHNOLOGY AND ONLINE SPACES

UNFPA held discussions in 2022-2023 which revealed technology-facilitated gender-based violence (TFGBV) in Lao PDR included:

- Social media based recruitment for sex work and trafficking; Image-based abuse; and
- Cyberstalking.
