The roadmap provides a strategic framework to increase access to comprehensive sexuality education for adolescents and youth aged 10 to 25 who are not enrolled in any formal education system. However, effective out-of-school CSE requires resources designed with meaningful input from adolescents and youth, aligned with global standards, addressing critical topics such as gender equality, health, and rights, and being adaptable to diverse contexts.
