Purpose of consultancy	The UNFPA Country Office, in Lao PDR in partnership with the Lao Statistics Bureau (LSB) wishes to augment and improve public-facing digital communication channels for the 2025 Lao Population and Housing Census. Therefore, UNFPA Lao CO is seeking to hire a consultant to provide technical support for developing a National Census public information website as a satellite site to the LSB website to inform and engage the general public on the upcoming census.		
	The main focus of the work is to develop a simple and easy-to-use, visually attractive website to inform/educate the public on the significance of the national census, and the census process, as well as provide an overview of the census data.		
	To appeal to, and engage as diverse an audience as possible, the site will require multimedia integration, interactivity, and gamification – explaining key concepts related to the census process and its public value in simple, accessible formats.		
	The work will be conducted under the overall coordination and oversight of the UNFPA Policy and Census Coordinator, and close consultation with the UNFPA Country Office Communication Unit and in close coordination and collaboration with the Census IT Unit of the Lao Statistics Bureau (LSB) as a key implementing partner. The consultancy work will be implemented in accordance with the UNFPA's policies and procedures, as the hiring agency, and in collaboration with national counterparts as required.		
Background	To ensure the successful information sharing, publicity and communication of the 5th Population and Housing Census (PHC) in 2025, the LSB recognizes the critical need for a dedicated census website/webpage. As the first digital census in the history of Laos, utilizing CAPI applications (CSPro software) for data collection and satellite imagery for GIS mapping, this marks a significant technological leap forward. With the project document finalized, the census questionnaire and CAPI applications developed, and extensive testing conducted, LSB is entering the final stages of preparation, including a final field test tentatively in May 2025.		
	The census can only succeed with widespread societal support and active participation from various groups. The interaction between LSB, stakeholders, and the broader public is essential to ensure transparency, build trust, and encourage engagement. The UN Principles and Recommendations highlight the importance of targeted communication with three distinct groups: users of census data, participants in census operations, and the general public. In the case of Lao PDR, the international donor community is an additional crucial audience.		
	A dedicated census website in English and Lao is vital to effectively reach and engage these diverse audiences. This platform will serve as the central hub for informing and educating the public about the significance of the national census, detailing the census process, and providing an accessible overview of the census documentation and data. To appeal to a wide audience, the website must be simple, easy-to-use, and visually attractive. It will feature multimedia integration, interactivity,		

and gamification to explain key concepts related to the census and its public value in a straightforward and engaging manner.

By providing a comprehensive, interactive, and user-friendly platform, the dedicated census website will play a crucial role in ensuring that all groups are well-informed and actively engaged in the census process, thereby contributing to the overall success of the 2025 census.

Scope of work

The recruited consultant provides technical support and develops a census microsite as well as the capacity building for government staff to manage and update the census website and census data dissemination platform. The detailed assignment including:

- **Produce and present a master document** containing the proposed designs and wireframes of the satellite site to UNFPA and LSB counterparts for review and approval.
- **Develop the satellite site** in both English and Lao, ensuring alignment with the designs approved in the master document. Lao text will be provided in accordance with the technical specifications outlined by the consultant.
- Improve the design of the LSB website's front page by incorporating the 5th Population and Housing Census elements and ensuring a seamless functional link to the newly developed satellite site.
- **Develop and integrate value-added content**, including quizzes/games and infographics, timer, to enhance public engagement on the website.
- **Develop and incorporate a condensed, high-level census data dashboard** into the satellite site, ensuring easy access and user-friendly data visualization.
- **Create a comprehensive maintenance manual** for the satellite site, detailing procedures for upkeep and regular content updates.
- Conduct a capacity-building training session for LSB staff on maintaining and updating the satellite site, including data integration. Perform final updates based on on-site interaction and feedback from staff..

Payment modality:

- First Installment: 40% of total contract amount upon completion of the deliverable 1, 2 and 3 by March 15, 2025
- Second Installment: 60% of total contract amount upon the completion of deliverable 4, 5 and 6, by June May 30, 2025.

In addition to the consultancy fee, any travel costs related to this consultancy including air tickets, Daily Subsistence Allowance (DSA), terminal, and visa fees will be reimbursed upon completion of the mission, submission of F10 claim form, and in line with UNFPA rules and regulations.
