Purpose of consultancy	The UNFPA Country Office, in Lao PDR in partnership with the Ministry of Planning and Investment (MPI) wishes to develop an online monitoring dashboard for the 14th recommendations and Call for Action of the National Conference on Population and Development (NCPD) as well as the National Population and Development Policy (NPDP 2019-2030). The dashboard will be a tool to track the progress of implementation based on the defined indicators and will provide easy-to-use interfaces to manage, visualize, and analyze the datasets, making them more broadly accessible to MPI users, line ministries, and the general public.		
	The recruited consultant will provide technical support as following:

	The work will be conducted under the overall coordination and oversight of the UNFPA Population Unit and close consultation with the Department of Planning of MPI as key implementing partner. The consultancy work will be implemented in accordance with the UNFPA's policies and procedures, as the hiring agency, and in collaboration with national counterparts as required.		
Background	The GoL has developed several national action plans/strategies/laws and adopted the National Population and Development Policy (NPDP 2019-2030) including 9 priority goals in line with the ICPD PoA and the Nairobi commitment. The government is also accelerating efforts to end maternal mortality, increase access to rights-based family planning, and end gender-based violence and harmful practices, empowering the young population to realize the demographic dividend.		
	Despite the firm Government's commitment, there are still challenges and unfinished businesses that need to be tackled urgently. Adolescent girls are particularly vulnerable due to high rates of early pregnancy which is one of the highest in the region. Nearly 1 in 4 girls aged 15-19 years old are in		

marriage and/or in union, and 89 of every 1,000 girls in the same age had given birth, which is among the highest in ASEAN. (The median age at first marriage for women is 19.2 years which has been relatively unchanged over the past two decades).

In October 2023, MPI with support of UNFPA, organized the first national population and development conference to prepare the Lao government to attend the 7th Asia and Pacific Population Conference in November 2023. The conference was chaired by H.E Deputy prime minister of Laos, at the end of the conference the deputy prime minister delivered national recommendations and called for actions with a total 14 key priorities. The 14 key recommendations and call for actions of NCPD are fully integrated in the national statement and delivered by the Deputy Minister of MPI at the 7<sup>th</sup> APPC, November 2023.

In order to fully track and properly monitor the implementation of the key recommendation of first NCPD and the progress of key indicators and strategic interventions of NPDP 2019-2030 and ensure the tracking of existing policies and plans align with national population and development policy 2019-2030 and beyond 2030. There is a need to develop a dashboard with indicators and targets especially on how the government could effectively and fully implement the NCPD recommendations and call for actions and NPDP will actively involve line ministries and support of DPs.

## Scope of work

The recruited consultant provides technical support and develop a NCPD dashboard and M&E framework of NPDP NCPD 2019-2030 through consultation process and involvement and participations of concerned line ministries and sectors as well as the capacity build for government staff to have capacity to manage and update the dashboard and M&E framework of NDPD. The detailed assignment including:

- Develop a comprehensive database document or user manual consolidating all recommendations and calls to action from the National Committee for Population and Development (NCPD), ensuring the inclusion of key indicators and targets for the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) framework of the National Population and Development Policy (NPDP).
- Design wireframes for the proposed dashboard, outlining key features and functionalities. These wireframes will be presented to stakeholders for feedback and refinement prior to final development.
- Finalize the development of the NCPD dashboard and NPDP M&E framework, ensuring seamless integration with the existing MPI platform (website), incorporating key indicators, data visualization capabilities, and reporting functions.
- **Conduct data analysis and functionality testing** to ensure the dashboard performs accurately and reliably, validating its ability to pull data from external sources and generate consistent reports.
- **Design and develop universal web applications** related to the dashboard, ensuring integration with external data sources to enhance its functionality and improve user experience.
- Conduct a capacity-building training session for government staff (MPI) on managing and maintaining the dashboard, equipping them with the necessary skills for ongoing updates, troubleshooting, and optimization of the system's functionalities.
