Purpose of consultancy:	Lao PDR Country Office is seeking an international consultant and national consultant to work closely with UNFPA Gender Unit and national counterpart National Commission for the Advancement of Women, Mothers and Children (NCAWMC).		
	The purpose of this consultancy is to conduct the Mid Term Review of the		
	2 <sup>nd</sup> National Plan of Action on Prevention and Elimination of Violence Against Women and Violence against Children (2021-2025) (PEVAW NAP)		
	Lao PDR's second National Plan of Action was launched in November 2021, and runs from 2021- 2025. The National Plan of Action coordinates and consolidates the ending violence against women agenda both domestically and abroad. The commitments of the NAP align with international frameworks such as CEDAW, ICPD25, SDGs and Beijing Platform for Action. Building on the progress made by the first National Action Plan, the Plan sets out how Lao PDR will implement the objectives of the Ending Violence Against Women agenda in its programme support activities, diplomatic advocacy and policy-making.		
	A mid-term review of the NPA is expected to take place in Q2 of 2024. This will comprise a comprehensive examination of the implementation of the NPA in 2022 - Q1 of 2024, and recommend to revise achievable indicators and ways forward effectively implement the second half of the Plan in 2024-2025.		
Scope of work:  (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	The purpose of the Midterm Review is to assess progress to date against the commitments and indicators of the Second National Action Plan, and in doing so, to review the utility of the existing indicators.		
	The scope of the Midterm Review will examine the progress made on implementation of the Plan from its launch in November 2022 through to Q1 of 2024. The Review will report on progress against indicators and actions from all stakeholders who have roles and responsibilities under the NPA. The Midterm Review should also reflect on the commitments, indicators and actions of the Plan and propose to revise measurable indicators for the second half of Second National Action Plan of Elimination of Violence Against Women and Children.  The review should consider the following questions:  i) To what extent has progress been achieved in implementation?  ii) What challenges were encountered?  iii) What lessons have been learned and opportunities identified?  iv) What is the utility of each indicator? Might indicators be betterarticulated, and how?		

V) what are recommendations to on revising of indicators and ways forward to effectively implementation of the second half of the Second National Action Plan on Elimination of VAWC

The international consultant and national consultant will team up and divide and complete required tasks, meet with and take guidance from NCAWMC, UNFPA colleagues as well as a Review Committee to conduct and complete the Mid Term Review.

## Methodology

#### Stage 1:

International consultant and National Consultant will develop assessment questions for relevant line ministries and responsible sectors to complete, reporting on their implementing activities to date, to include, where appropriate, both quantitative and qualitative indicators of activities. NCAWMC will convene a "kick off" consultation with line ministries and sectors to disseminate the assessment questions. National Consultant, with the support of NCAMWC, to compile reports and translate.

### Stage 2.

International Consultant to conduct desk-based review of documents in English, including Nation Action Plan, the 9th NSEDP, NPA EVAW M&E framework, relevant compiled reports and other related documents. National consultant conducts desk-based review of documents in Lao language, including progress reports of the implementation of the 9th NSEDP, NPA EVAW and summarises for the international consultant to draft the inception report.

#### Stage 3.

International consultant to submit the inception report to NCAWMC and UNFPA to review for comments and identify and interview with the key informants who are responsible for providing progress reports of NPA EVAW implementation. The national consultant interviews selected key informants from line ministries and provincial authorities and summarises for the international consultant to draft the first draft report.

Stage 4. Meet with NCAMWC, relevant stakeholders and UNFPA to discuss the first draft Report.

Stage 5. Consultant to validate findings with those who led the reporting from the responsible actors and other key informants as identified in Stage 3.

Stage 6. Consultant to submit draft final report to NCAWMC, relevant stakeholders and UNFPA, to identify any necessary indicators revisions and ways forward for effective implementation of second half of NPA EVAW.

Stage 7. Consultant to submit final report to Review Committee.
