Purpose of consultancy	The UNFPA Country Office in Lao PDR is seeking to hire a national consultant to work closely with the UNFPA Population and Development Unit as well as the relevant national counterparts on the 2023 ICPD review.		
	The national consultant will provide technical, coordination and capacity building support to the Government of Lao PDR on population and development matters in preparation for the Seventh Asian and Pacific Population Conference in 2023, and the global review and appraisal of the implementation of the Programme of Action (PoA) of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) during the 57th session of the Commission on Population and Development in 2024. The support will be provided to the relevant organizations of the government of Lao PDR to:		
	 Complete the voluntary national survey in collaboration and consultation with UNFPA, MPI and relevant stakeholders for monitoring the progress of the implementation of ICPD PoA; Review and validate quantitative information and statistics on relevant SDG indicators identified in the monitoring framework; Develop a brief national ICPD report in line with the eleven priority action areas, and prepare the Government's statement for the 7th Asia and Pacific Population Conference. 		
	The work will be conducted in accordance with the UNFPA's policies and procedures, as the hiring agency, and in close collaboration with the Department of Planning, Ministry of Planning and Investment (DOP/MPI), Lao PDR.		
Background	The ICPD Programme of Action provides an invaluable framework to guide Member States in enhancing the quality of life and well-being of every individual and promoting human development by underscoring the interrelationship between development policies and programmes, human rights, and economic and social development. At the 20-year Asia-Pacific regional review of the Programme of Action, in 2013, ESCAP member States adopted the Asian and Pacific Ministerial Declaration on Population and Development. This Declaration serves as region-specific guidance on population and development in the context of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.		
	In 2018, a monitoring framework was presented to ESCAP and associated members to monitor progress in implementing the recommendations of both documents in the region. This framework was based on existing SDG indicators/targets to reduce the reporting burden on member States. The ESCAP, in 2020, endorsed the monitoring framework, noting that it would serve as an essential tool for voluntary, regular assessment and reporting of progress of implementation of the ICPD Programme of Action and the 2013 Ministerial Declaration.		
	ESCAP, with support from UNFPA, has developed a survey based on the monitoring framework to assist member States in collecting data and monitoring the implementation of the ICPD PoA and the 2013 Ministerial Declaration. The survey is highly qualitative in nature, aiming to understand the progress and achievements in all priority action areas, along with key challenges and lessons learned. Additionally, ESCAP has compiled quantitative information on the SDG indicators identified in the monitoring framework and is providing this information along with the survey. The data are sourced from the Global SDG Indicators Database maintained by the Statistics Division of the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs.		

	The process of the national voluntary survey should be led by a relevant government entity which is the Ministry of Planning and Investment of Lao PDR, through the national focal point on population and development, and with the support of the national consultant and UNFPA. The survey and monitoring framework are structured according to the priority actions identified in the Report of the Sixth Asian and Pacific Population Conference. As the Programme of Action of ICPD is a multi-dimensional framework, it is recommended that completion of the survey involves a consultative process with ministries and departments responsible for implementing the priority action areas and reporting the associated SDG indicators, and with the involvement of non- governmental stakeholders.
Scope of work	Against this backdrop, the main responsibility of the national consultant is to provide technical, coordination and capacity building support to the Government of Lao PDR to complete the ICPD review process and prepare for the 7th APPC. The national consultant is expected to work under the guidance of the Department of Planning of MPI and UNFPA. The 2023 ICPD review include the following areas and major steps:
	1. National Voluntary Survey/Questionnaire The national survey is a multi-dimensional framework including eleven priority action areas, structured, close-ended and open-ended questions. The Ministry of Planning and Investment (MPI) will lead the ICPD review process with the technical and coordination support from the national consultant and UNFPA.
	It is strongly recommended that a national survey be completed in a fully consultative process in order to include the views of all relevant line ministries and stakeholders especially youth organizations, unions and civil societies. Where needed, interviews with key relevant government officials need to be conducted.
	The methodology of completion of the questionnaire will include desk reviews of the existing reports and documents, in depth interviews with the key informants in the areas of population and development, focus groups discussions as required, and consultation meetings.
	The national consultant should facilitate the above process and use the above methodologies to support MPI in data collection and completion of the questionnaire. The national consultant should also facilitate at least two rounds of national consultation meetings to validate responses and collected data.
	2. 2023 ICPD report and validation of the SDGs' indicators baseline data and values Using the latest available data and statistics of the ICPD and SDG indicators, the consultant will prepare a brief analytic report (12-15 pages) on the status and trends of the indicators in line with the eleventh priority actions areas.
	The methodology will consist of desk review of relevant official documents and statistics, as well as the
	analysis of updated data sources. It is encouraged that the review of the statistics and data is made in
	light of the priority actions, SDG indicators and take into account socio-economic impact of COVID-19
	pandemic, as well as the effect of current economic downturn on vulnerable groups especially young women and girls.
