Terms of Reference for Individual International Consultant to support a stakeholders workshop on family planning programme in Lao PDR

Purpose of consultancy	To provide technical support and assistance to the Department of Hygiene and Health Promotion, Ministry of Health Lao PDR to conduct a stakeholders workshop with a view to develop a broader Family Planning strategy that includes a transition plan for the government.
Background	Lao PDR was one country among three that achieved its MDG5 target. Recent survey data also showed an average annual rate of reduction in maternal mortality ratio. And yet, the maternal mortality ratio of 185 deaths per 100,000 live births. The adolescent pregnancy rate in Lao PDR is the highest in the South-East Asia region with 87 births per 1,000 adolescent girls aged 15-19 years (LSIS III, 2023). Child marriages are also common in the country. 26.5 percent of girls aged 15-19 are already married or in-union and 17.4 percent of girls aged 15—19 had already given birth. The unmet need for family planning among unmarried adolescent girls aged 15-19 is 74%. Despite continued efforts to invest in the Family Planning programme, data from the Lao Social Indicator III, 2023, showed stagnation and for some indicators regression of the FP programme. Therefore, there is a need to revitalise the programme as well as galvanising stakeholders to renew efforts and support. To this end, UNFPA is looking for a consultant to support the Ministry of Health in collaboration with UNFPA to conduct an initial review of stakeholders in FP programme, develop a concept for the workshop and support to conduct the workshop as part of the preparatory work to develop a strategy for Family Planning.
Scope of work	The scope of work will include:
	 Conduct a desk review and in-person meeting with key players of MoH, relevant stakeholders', local experts and international organisations that implement/support sexual and reproductive health programme, including family planning Review/analysis progress of FP programme based on targets/goals set Develop a concept note for a consultation workshop to bring key partners together Support MOH to prepare materials/presentations for the workshop Work closely with MOH to facilitate the workshop Write report of the process and results/recommendations from the workshop

- Proven experience in strategic planning and implementation of data processing, and technical capacity building/training in developing countries.
- Proven experience in teamwork, especially in the field of public health and family planning intervention.
- Experience in team supports spirit in a complex multi-cultural environment is desirable.
- Experience in formal and on-the-job training for national staff and transfer of knowledge.
- Experience in design of public health, mother and child health and family planning large scale undertakings, particularly at the national strategy approach.
- Ability to work independently in a cross-cultural environment and demonstrated capacity to build strong relationships with local counterparts, MoH stakeholders, development partners and donor agencies.

- Excellent English language skills, especially on strategic language and terminology.
