TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIVIDUAL <u>NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL CONSULTANT</u> TO CONDUCT ASSESSMENT OF 'WOMEN'S 3 GOODS' ROLL OUT IN LAO PDR		
Hiring Office:	UNFPA Country Office Lao PDR	
Purpose of consultancy:	The "Women's 3 Goods" handbook aligns with the Government's "Three Builds" model, which involves building the capacities of provinces, districts and villages to become "developed units" under the Women Development Plan (2016-2020). LWU has the role to strengthen families and villages based on the Three Builds directive, and developed the Women's 3 Goods Handbook accordingly in 2020, finalised 2021.	
	LWU have been using the Women's 3 Goods handbook in communities since 2021, and in 2023 sensitised 20,364 community members with UNFPA support. LWU then returns to the communities at a later date to conduct "evaluations" of families and villages to assess compliance with the 'Women's 3 Goods" model.	
	During the first revision of the Handbook UNFPA provided technical guidance to ensure inclusion of thematic areas, including shared decision-making, dissemination of gender equality and EVAWC law, women's credit unions, early marriage and GBV, participation in leadership, access to family planning, girls and boys' education levels etc.	
	To ensure this Government initiative meets international standards and thereby continue to receive UNFPA support, UNFPA Lao PDR Country Office is seeking to hire an international and national consultant to conduct an assessment and conduct a second revision of the content.	
	The purpose of these exercises is to	
	 conduct an assessment as to the effectiveness of the 'Women's 3 Goods' roll out, including conducting Informant Interviews, Focus Group Discussions (KIIs and FGDs) in the field, organising multistakeholder consultation to collecting feedback from representatives of provincial Women's Union and line ministries and drafting of Inception Report including recommendations, as well as feedback provided by LWU and line ministries during multi stakeholder consultation (national consultant), and analyse, review and revise the substantive content of the 'Women's 3 Goods' based on the assessment to meet international standards, including the Government of Laos' commitments under CEDAW, ICPD, and SDG5 (international consultant). 	
	Two consultants work closely with the UNFPA Gender Unit and national counterpart Lao Women's Union (LWU).	
Scope of work:	Assessment of implementation (national consultant):	
	The specific objectives of the assessment includes:	

(Description of services, activities, or outputs)

- Assess the relevance of the intervention.
- Assess the effectiveness and efficiency of the intervention in progressing towards the achievement of results.
- Assess the overall sustainability of the intervention results, including the level of national ownership, national capacity development, sustainability aspects in intervention design and compliance with international GBV standards.
- Identify and validate important lessons learned and provide actionable recommendations for the design and implementation of the intervention or an iteration of the intervention.
- Analyze and assess how an integrated RH and GBV approach has been successful for increasing access to information on RH and GBV services
- Analyze and assess the comparative advantage of it.
- Identify other relevant approaches and measures to address GBV, which were not considered in this intervention

Adopting the UNEG methodology, the assessment questions will be under the following criteria:

<u>Relevance</u>: The extent to which the objectives of the intervention are consistent with beneficiaries' requirements, country needs, global priorities, partners' and donors' policies.

An example of questions:

• To what extent is the intervention relevant to the needs and priorities of the direct and indirect beneficiaries, as well as the ones defined by government and development partners?

<u>Effectiveness</u>: The extent to which the intervention's objectives were achieved, taking into account their relative importance and impact.

An example of questions:

• To what extent were the expected results achieved? What were the enabling factors that contributed to the achievement of results and what actions need to be taken to overcome any barriers that limit the progress?

<u>Efficiency</u>: A measure of how economically resources/inputs (funds, expertise, time, etc.) are converted to results.

An example of questions:

• To what extent did the management structure of the intervention support efficiency for programme implementation?

<u>Impact</u>: Positive and negative, primary and secondary long-term effects produced by the intervention, directly or indirectly, intended or unintended.

An example of questions:

• What were the unintended effects, positive or negative - if any, of each of the intervention areas? In which ways did they affect the different stakeholders?

<u>Sustainability</u>: The continuation of benefits from the intervention after major development assistance has been completed. or: The probability of continued long-term benefits. The resilience to risk of the net benefit flows over time.

The evaluation will assess administrative, institutional, technical and sustainability and explore possible opportunities for expansion of the Women's 3 Goods roll out.

An example of questions:

• To what extent are the benefits of the intervention likely to continue?

Content Analysis and Revision (International consultant)

Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) is the prerequisite for achieving gender equality and women's empowerment, and vice versa.

The content of the Handbook is to be reviewed and revised to align with:

- The human rights approach and gender equality principles are integrated in the programme approach and implementation, aligning with the Government of Laos' commitments under CEDAW, ICPD, and SDG5.
- 2. Opportunities for universal access to SRH information, services, and rights
- 3. Opportunities for accessing equal primary, secondary and further education for girls and boys
- 4. Rights to freedom from any forms of violence and harmful practices, including early marriage
- 5. Opportunities for societal participation at the community, district, provincial and national level
- 6. Opportunities for economic empowerment (incl. female labor force participation, entrepreneurship and more).

All the above will empower individuals, households, communities and society at large.

The consultants will meet with and take guidance from LWU and UNFPA colleagues.

Methodology

- 1) **Preparation:** Desk Literature Review and consultation with UNFPA and relevant Government counterparts, development of assessment matrix
- **2) Data collection**: Observations in the field, Key Informant Interviews, Focus Group Discussions and other data collection tools.
- 3) Analysis and synthesis: analysis of data and interpretation of findings, and drafting of Inception Report including recommendations, as well as feedback provided by line ministries during multi stakeholder consultation
